# <u>Homework</u>

In year 6, it is vital that we support our children to gain greater independence in the completion of their homework, in order to help them become 'Secondary Ready' by the end of the year. It is expected that your child will continue to read independently at home and complete the task in their reading record (please see newsletter to ensure your child is completing the correct week), learn their spellings and study the information on their topic knowledge organisers each week, which will make up part of the weekly homework.

In addition to these expectations, we will be setting a Maths task every week. This will be focused upon basic skills, and will be in a familiar format, based upon class learning from the week, so the children should be able to complete the tasks reasonably unsupported.
