Key Vocabulary:

Identity	The way that we see and express ourselves.
Portrait	A representation of a person in which the face is the main theme.
Abstract	Art that doesn't try to represent visual reality.
Silhouette 	An image or design in a single tone.
Profile	The side-view of the face.
Tint	Adding white to a colour to create a lighter version of the colour.
Shade	Adding black to darken a colour.
Composition	The arrangement of visual elements in a piece of work.
Form	Refers to objects that are 3 dimensional.
Embellishment	A decorative detail added to make something attractive

Key Knowledge:



Pointillism: A style of art where tiny dots of colour make up a larger image.



Expressionism: A style of art where the artist wants to express a feeling through the work they create- Jean-Michel Basquiat.

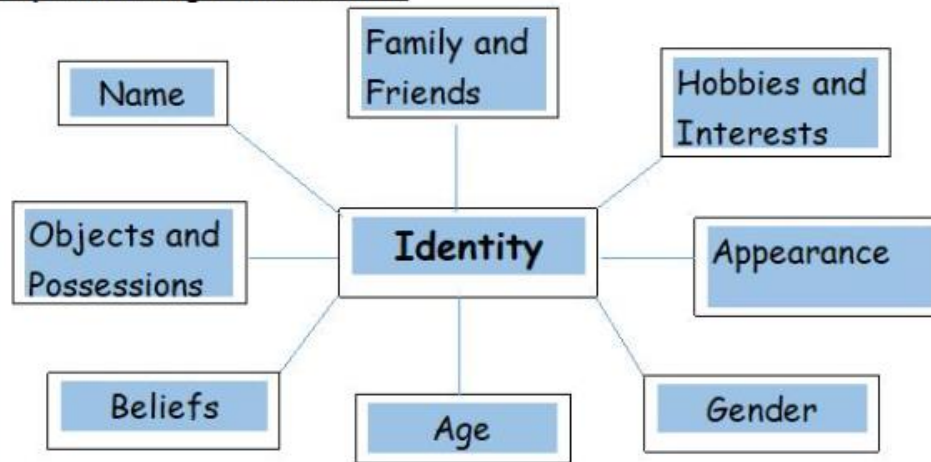


Pop Art: A style of art that uses bold, printed, simple images of everyday items or people- Andy Warhol.

Key Knowledge and Skills:



Continuous Line Drawing:

A technique where you don't take your drawing implement off of the page.



Mixing Skin Tones:

Mixing the primary colours in different ratios can make different skin tones.



Grid Method of portraiture:



Step 1: Choose an Image.

Step 2: Draw Grid Lines over the image.

Step 3: Draw a Separate Grid on plain paper.

Step 4: Sketch in what you can see one square at a time.

Step 5: Erase the Grid Lines over your drawn image.

Step 6: Add shading to your image.
