<u>Autumn Term 2 Topic:</u>	Who do you think you are?

Dear Parents / Carers

We hope that you enjoyed the half term break and that your children are ready for a busy term ahead.

This term your children will be immersing themselves in an art based unit entitled 'Who do you think you are?' We will explore our own identity and study artists who have created their own self-portraits. Alongside this Curriculum Newsletter, your children will bring home this term's Art Knowledge Organiser, which contains key knowledge, dates, figures and vocabulary that the children should learn, as part of homework, by the end of the term when they will take their 'end of topic quizzes'.

Focus on Curriculum

Below outlines some of the exciting things your child will learn about and experience this term, through the different curriculum areas.

<u>Homework</u>

In year 6, it is vital that we support our children to gain greater independence in the completion of their homework, in order to help them become 'Secondary Ready' by the end of the year.

<u>Reading</u>

It is expected that your child will continue to read independently at home and complete the task in their reading record (please see newsletter to ensure your child is completing the correct week), We will also regularly send home a reading task which we will complete in class in the upcoming week. Please can you read this text with your children and discuss it's meaning.

<u>Spelling</u>

Spellings will come home on Wednesday's, to learn, ready for a class test the following Wednesday.

<u>Maths</u>

A Maths task every week. This will be focused upon basic skills, and will be in a familiar format, based upon class learning from the week, so the children should be able to complete the tasks reasonably unsupported.

In addition to these expectations, children should study the information on their topic knowledge organisers each week, which will make up part of the weekly homework.
