

Dear Parents / Carers

We hope that you have had a really lovely Half term break and that your children are feeling ready for the final summer term ahead!

This term your children will be learning about Amelia Earhart in our topic 'Whatever happened to Amelia Earhart?' Alongside this Curriculum Newsletter, your children will bring home this term's Knowledge Organiser, which contains key knowledge, dates, figures and vocabulary that the children should learn, as part of homework by half term when they will take their 'end of topic quiz'.

Focus on Curriculum

History	 Talk about important people beyond living memory using a range of historical vocabulary. Use historical terms to describe the passage of time, e.g. modern, recent, long ago, older etc.
	• Describe similarities and differences between the lives of people.
	• Place objects, people and events beyond own experiences in time order.
	 Know about a famous person from outside the UK and explain why they are famous
English	The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch
Science	• Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.
	 Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the simple ideas of a food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.
	 Ask simple questions and recognise that they can be answered in different ways. Observe closely, using simple equipment. Perform simple tests. Identify and classify. Use their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions. Gather and record data to help answer questions.
