- There are seven continents on our planet that are Asia. Africa, North America, South America, Antartica, Europe and Australia.
- The five oceans on our planet are the Atlantic Ocean, Pacific Ocean, Indian Ocean, Arctic Ocean and Southern Ocean.
- The **UK** is in the continent within **Europe** and lies between the **Atlantic Ocean** and the North Sea.
- Australia is part of the continent, Oceania. It is four times the length of the UK at its widest point. It is the sixth largest country in the world. It is on the opposite side of the world to the UK and in the Southern Hemisphere. The capital city of Australia is Canberra.
- The diverse landscapes in Australia include rainforests, mountains, deserts, coastal plains, lakes and rivers.
- There are 3 climates in Australia as it crosses 3 climates zones: temperate, arid and tropical. It faces extreme weather such as cyclones and drought.
